


# Chook, Chook, Chook, Chook, Chook

Notice, please, that the 2 cadence points are mi-re-do. Even if your students are solfege novices, they can practice (and enjoy) those 3 hand signs.

## Math Extension

Have a student choose a number from 1 to 4. Ask a different student to choose a new number from 1 to 4. Then insert those numbers into the song. (Example: "3 of them are yellow, and 2 of them are brown.") The problem (literally) is to figure out the final digit, which will add up to 10.

So: "3 of them are yellow, and 2 of them are brown. And 5 of them are speckled red--the nicest in the town.")

The game can continue as long as you like.
